- **White** 3-ring, 1-inch binder (1)
- 1-subject notebooks (any color/design) (2)
- Composition (marbled styled) notebook (1)
- Medium pencil bag for your backpack (1)

- "Expo" marker pack (4) darker colors are best
- glue sticks (3 minimum)
- Computer headphones
- kid scissors that are comfortable for you! (1)
- #2, sharpened Ticonderoga pencils (2)
- Pink eraser pack/pencil erasers
- Black "Flair"/felt pen (2)
- "Sharpie" markers - optional
- Computer stylus - optional
- **Unscented** baby wipes (2 packs)
- Water bottle with a **straw** attachment is encouraged.
Please make sure it has a strong lid closure!
- Blue pen (1)
- Colored pencils (1 box)

Complete the Google Form when you are finished with the book, and be prepared to present your topic to your class when you come to 3rd Grade in September.

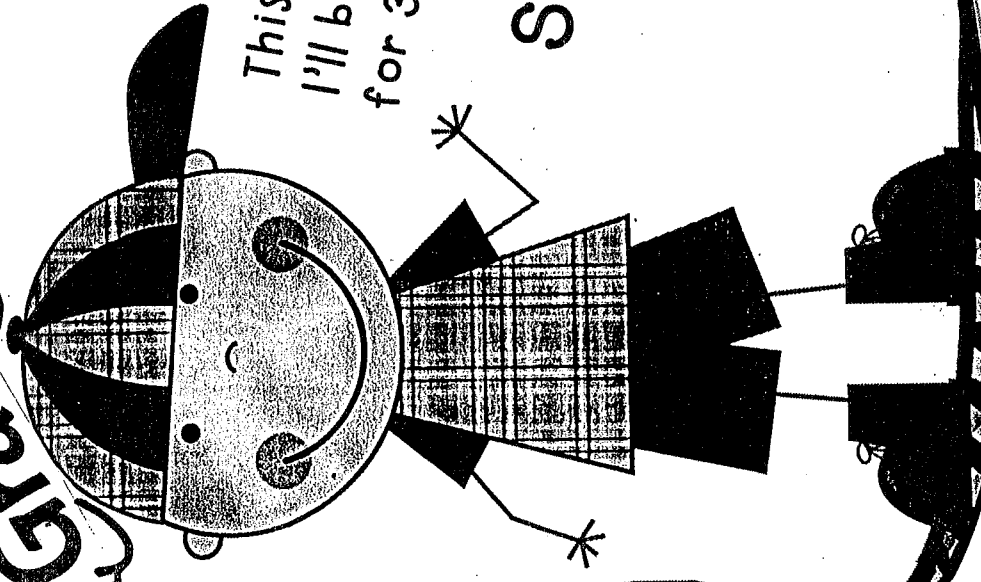

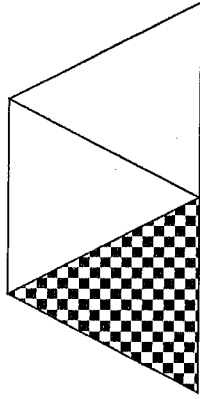

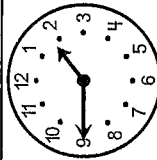

How many equal parts are in the rectangle? What is each part called?

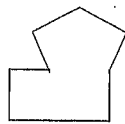


Wednesday
